The Journalism Career Fair hosted 221 students who were looking for internships and full-time positions. **Patty Noland** coordinated the event, and would like to thank the staff and faculty members who attended the fair and promoted it among their students.

Carol Holstead spoke at Magazine Interest Night, a meeting organized by journalism students who want to learn more about or work for magazines. Twenty-four students attended. Students requested a second Magazine Interest Night; one will be scheduled for after spring break.

Holstead presented three mini classes for KU Junior Day, March 4, a recruiting event created by the Office of Admissions. Holstead spoke to about 150 high school juniors and their parents.

Are the internships paid?

The majority of the internships are paid; but does vary pending on agency placement. If selected for an interview, we encourage you to ask if the internship is paid or not.

Are the internships only for political science majors?

No! We are looking for a very diversified group of students to intern in various state agencies. We've hired interns in marketing, communications, information technology, economics, engineering, food science, finance, law, mathematics, political science, etc. Often times projects are created around the skill sets of applicants.

How do I submit my application?

When can I expect to hear back about the status of my application?
